

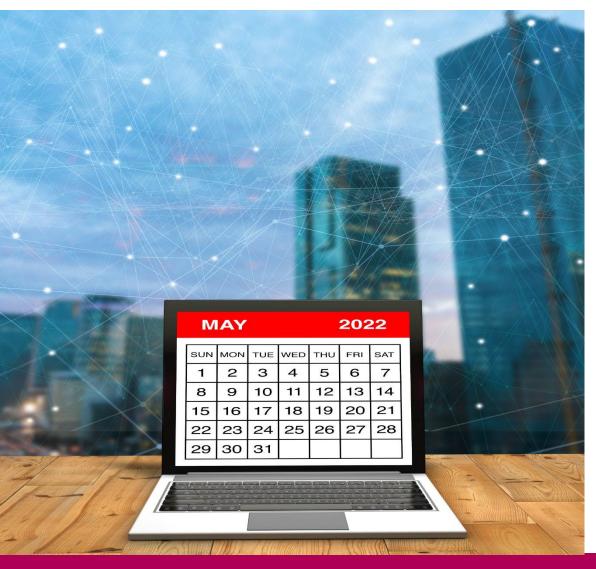
German E-Invoicing Mandate: Summary

Overview of Germanys electronic invoicing regulations

→ 2025-10-10, Finance
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Classification: Public







Key Dates

January 1st, 2025:

Buyers must be able to receive compliant invoices.

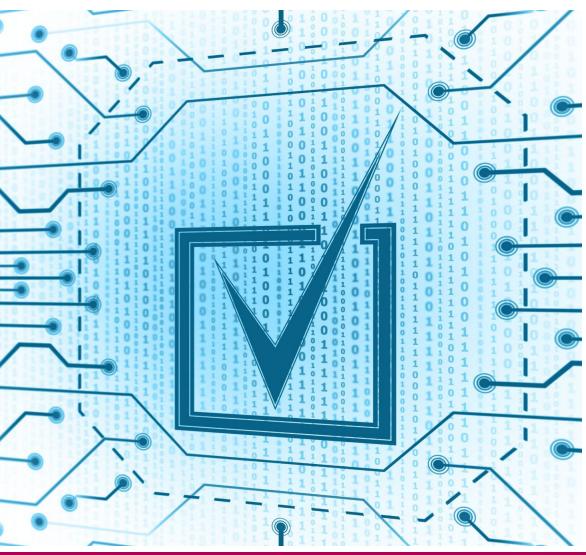
January 1st, 2027:

Suppliers with a turnover above €800,000 in the previous year must issue invoices as compliant e-invoices.

January 1st, 2028:

All suppliers must issue invoices as compliant e-invoices.





Purpose and Scope

Scope of Mandate

The mandate requires all domestic B2B invoices in Germany to comply with the EN 16931 electronic invoicing standard.

Applicability and Exemptions

The mandate applies to businesses residing in Germany, with possible exemptions for VAT-registered entities without residency.

Phased Implementation Timeline

Implementation starts in 2025 with buyers receiving e-invoices, followed by suppliers phased in by 2027 and 2028 based on turnover.

Objectives and Alignment

The mandate aims to modernize VAT systems, reduce fraud, and align with EU ViDA digital tax initiatives.





Invoice Format and Transmission

Flexible Delivery Methods

The German mandate allows multiple invoice delivery methods including einvoicing formats (Peppol), SFTP, email, and EDI connections.

Standard-Compliant Formats

- Invoices must comply with EN 16931
- Accepted formats include Peppol BIS, XRechnung, and ZUGFeRD supporting structured data.
- PDFs alone are not compliant unless embedded with structured data (e.g., ZUGFeRD).

Intercompany and EDI

- EDI can continue provided it complies with EN 16931.
- Intercompany must abide by regulations
- Germany may implement invoice reporting in the future, which could affect EDI connections.

Processing & Compliance

- E-invoices are **structured data files**, not visual documents.
- No government portal for B2B invoice exchange.
- Businesses must archive invoices in their original format for 10 years.





Exemptions and Cross-Border Rules

Cross Border Invoices

- Invoices sent to other countries do not need to be e-invoices and can be sent as PDFs.
- Similarly, invoices received from outside Germany are not required to comply with EN 16931

Exceptions that do not need to comply with EN 16931

- Invoices with a value below €250
- Tax-exempt services (as defined in §4 UStG)
- Transportation tickets.



1. What is an e-invoice?

- A structured **data file** sent from the supplier's billing system to the buyer's AP system.
- Not meant for human reading—processed directly by software.
- **PDFs are not e-invoices**, unless they contain embedded structured data (e.g., ZUGFeRD).

2. What is EN 16931?

- Defines what data must be included, not how it's formatted.
- Formats like Peppol BIS, XRechnung, and ZUGFeRD are compatible.

3. What is XRechnung?

- A format developed by the **German government** for B2G invoicing.
- Fully compatible with EN 16931.





4. What is ZUGFeRD?

- A hybrid format combining structured data and PDF visualization.
- Allows both machine and human readability.
- Compatible with EN 16931

5. Are PDF invoices allowed?

- No, unless they are ZUGFeRD.
- Standard PDFs lack structured data and are not compliant.

6. What is an e-invoicing network?

- Functions like a phone system—routes invoices based on recipient address.
- Open networks (Peppol) allow interoperability.
- Closed networks require all parties to use the same provider.





7. What is Peppol?

- A specific e-invoice format compatible with EN 16931.
- A secure network that connects different e-invoicing systems so suppliers and buyers can exchange documents easily—even if they use different providers.
- A set of standards for documents like orders, invoices, and shipping notices—making sure everyone speaks the same digital language.
- Managed by a non-profit called OpenPeppol.
- Includes Peppol BIS, a technical format that defines how documents should look and be delivered.

8. Can I send an invoice attachments using Peppol?

- Yes, attachments in formats like PDF, PNG,JPEG, CSV, or spreadsheet files can be sent.
- Attachments must not be invoice images to avoid ambiguity over which is the legal invoice.
